




Annual Survey Results May/June 2017

#1 Issue: Affordable Housing and Homelessness


3. If you could tell your city leaders one thing, what would it be?

4. Do you believe real estate developers should be required to pay Impact Fees to help defray the costs of building new schools, fire stations, and sidewalks * as the city's population grows?


- Yes. Make developers pay their fair share.

* (Note: There is some disagreement as to whether State law allows Impact Fees to be used for sidewalks, even if those sidewalks would be part of the roads near or impacted by the newly constructed development. See RCW: 82.02.090)


5. Do you believe the city should build a new police station to replace the old one in North Seattle as soon as possible?

- Not sure.




6. Do you believe we need more bike lanes?
